New York City Organizations Host Successful Launch of Local Effort to Pave Better Road to Citizenship for Legal Permanent Residents

Advocates with the New Americans Campaign held 19 workshop and clinic events that assisted nearly 300 legal permanent residents in New York City with the citizenship process

New York, NY—In coordination with the New Americans Campaign, New York City legal service providers and nonprofit organizations hosted a free week-long series of naturalization events in locations throughout the city from March 16-23, 2013.

The weeklong series of events offered participants the opportunity to receive pro-bono legal consultations, eligibility screenings, and civics and English study materials. Several computer–based workshops, including the campaign's first New York City Public Library event on March 22^{nd} at the Brooklyn Public Library, featured the new award-winning CitizenshipWorks system, an online platform that allows service providers and volunteers to quickly guide aspiring citizens through the citizenship application process.

To date, the groups have collectively hosted more than 63 workshops and clinics in New York City, providing over 8,300 citizenship consultations to legal permanent residents in the area. According to estimates from the Department of Homeland Security, one million legal permanent residents are currently eligible to become citizens in the state of New York, including more than 680,000 in New York City alone.

"The New Americans Campaign is providing a great service to the community," said Elizabeth Gomez, a legal permanent resident since 2008 that attended the March 18th event co-sponsored by NALEO Educational Fund and Church World Service. "I am grateful that I had this opportunity and I now have the confidence necessary to finally file my application and take the language test."

The local launch is part of a groundbreaking effort to modernize and streamline access to naturalization services, so that greater numbers of legally qualified permanent residents take the critical step to becoming American citizens. Participating New York City organizations are part of the New Americans Campaign's national network of legal service providers, faith-based organizations, community leaders and foundations that are paving a better road to citizenship in eight cities across the country.
