WHERE DO I GET MY CERTIFICATE OF DISPOSTION?

If you have ever been arrested or convicted of an offense, you must get a <u>Certificate of Disposition</u> for every arrest, from the Court Clerk in the COUNTY where you were arrested. You should make sure you have:

- The docket number (if you know it)
- Date of arrest
- Valid government issued photo ID
- \$10 cash(exact change only)

Please note that if you were an issued a summons all charges must be paid in full for you to receive your certificate of disposition. The certificate will tell you what offense(s) you were charged with, what offense (s) you were convicted of, what date you were convicted, and the sentence imposed. If you have been arrested more than once, you must get a separate Certificate for each incident.

If you have been issued a summons by the Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA), get a disposition letter. In NYC, this is obtained at the NYC Transit Adjudication Bureau, 29 Gallatin Place, 3rd Floor, Brooklyn, NY 11201, (347) 643-5805. A \$10 fee, government ID and Social Security Card will be required. If you do not have a Social Security Number, you must provide a notarized statement that you have not been issued one.
